Mondays, beginning at 12:30, we provide clothing & toiletries.

Tuesdays, we have a psychology team here and we operate a drop-in mental health centre. There is no need to register and our guests don't need to be homeless to attend our service.

Jesuit Church of the Immaculate Conception/Central London Catholic Churches - CLCC Farm Street Church Homeless Service – 07864 642 543 **Arrupe Hall, 114 Mount Street, Mayfair, London W1K 3AH**

This service aims to create a safe environment that is clean, welcoming, social, and a space where guests can be. There is no ticket system. Open twice a week on Wednesdays and Saturdays between 11.30am and 2pm, guests are welcomed at 11.30am for hot/cold drinks, fruit and biscuits. A hot meal is then served between 12noon and 2pm. Activities which guests enjoy on site include chess and taking part in creative writing. There is also a priest who hosts the Lectio Divina Bible study for the group.

Wednesday Club in basement hall, 4.00 till 7.00 pm. We provide seated indoor space on an open access basis, and we provide sandwiches, pies and mash, hot and cold drinks etc, plus some clothing and toiletries.

Thursday Club in basement hall, 3.00 till 6.00 pm. As above but without hot food apart from soup. Hall capacity is around 50.
