An overview of the year was given by Jonathan Miller. Alasdair Mackenzie gave an update on the work and restructuring of LPM, and, as Treasurer, Joan Ishibashi presented the CTiW annual accounts. The American International Church and The Welsh Church of Central London were welcomed as new members of CTiW. The meeting also included a small exhibition of artwork by prisoners.



The panel discussion which followed was chaired by Alasdair MacKenzie. The main speaker was Hannah Rich from Theos Think Tank (https://www.theosthinktank.co.uk) on the subject of "A torn safety net", followed by other speakers representing various organisations working with homeless, namely Central London Catholic Churches, The Connection at St Martins-in-the-Fields, West London Mission, Salvation Army, who were joined by invited representatives who themselves had first-hand experience of being part of the homeless community.

LONDON PRISONS MISSION UPDATE

Safe Homes for Women Leaving Prison

t has been a little while since I have shared news on what is going on with the London Prisons Mission. Many of you will know the redoubtable John Plummer, and you may know that he has had to retire as coordinator of the LPM due to health concerns. However, he has continued to engage with the office of the Mayor of London and key members and committees of the GLA to ensure the recommendations of the Safe Homes for Women Leaving Prison initiative, championed by the London Prisons Mission, are enshrined in the policies of the Mayor's office.

Work by John and others successfully secured a Safer Homes motion put to the GLA in 2022, which was unanimously supported, calling on the Mayor to embed the recommendations of the Safe Homes initiative into his Blueprint for Women In Contact With the Criminal Justice System. The Safer Homes Motion, now formally approved by the Mayor, is a significant policy statement and several leading Assembly Members are striving to convert this into measures for delivery by responsible agencies throughout all London boroughs to address the plight of about 50 vulnerable women released from prison each month and needing to resume residence in London. The Future of the London Prisons Mission

Before the COVID 19 pandemic, the London Prisons Mission acted as a network for those in Westminster churches and beyond who wished to explore opportunities to work voluntarily to support those in London prisons, and those leaving them. LPM's purpose is also to make available for churches of all denominations accurate information about our criminal justice and penal system. The pandemic put a stop to a great deal of our work as prisons closed their doors to visitors and enforced often very tough and restrictive regimes, largely keeping visitors out of prisons. Several key members of the LPM have moved away from London in the past year, and as noted earlier, John Plummer has retired as co-ordinator.

In November 2022 and February 2023, I chaired two meetings of a new core group of London Prisons Mission co-ordinators. The November meeting was hosted by Revd Roddy Leece of St George's Hanover Square and attended by Niki White of St Michael's Chester Square, Revd Ayla Lepine of St James Piccadilly, Sarah Jane Vernon an LPM trustee, Ian Pentney of Bloomsbury Baptist Church and myself. In February we were joined by Judith Gardiner from Bloomsbury Baptist Church, and Angela Sheard, from St Martin-in-the-Fields, alongside Ali McMillan from Methodist Central Hall, Jared Jaggers of the American Church and Donna McDowell from St Paul's Marylebone.

Ian, Judith, Angela, Ali, Jared and Donna agreed at the February meeting to act as joint co-ordinators of the LPM and I hope that they will be joined by others. We were very happy to be joined in February by Patrick Wright, managing chaplain at Heathrow Immigration Removal Centre who talked about the work of the IRC and his role. We are currently planning a visit for LPM co-ordinators to explore possibilities for volunteering there.

Our next meeting will provisionally take place on Monday 22 May at St Martin-in-the-Fields where we will be joined by Lewis Lzeblan, the managing chaplain at HMP Wandsworth. I will continue to keep Churches Together In Westminster updated on our progress.

The Salvation Army are opening a new Community Wardrobe on 1 June 2023, at 9, Princes Street, especially concerning family working for children and clothing for interviews.
